2. (iv) Report on Internal assessment mechanism:

Govt. Degree College, Shri Renuka Ji, has implemented a robust internal assessment mechanism to evaluate students' academic performance throughout the session. This mechanism is designed in strict adherence to the guidelines laid down by Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla. It is rigorously followed by all the departments (Commerce, Economics, History, Political Science, English, and Hindi) of the college. The internal assessment, which carries a total of 30 marks, serves as a comprehensive tool for continuous evaluation, providing students with the opportunity to showcase their knowledge and skills through various means.

The internal assessment format is divided into three key components:

- **Attendance (5 marks):** Students are awarded marks based on their attendance. This criterion emphasizes the importance of regular participation and engagement in class. - **Mid-Term Examinations (15 marks):** A major portion of the internal assessment is derived from performance in the mid-term tests (MTT). Mid-term tests serve as preparatory milestones, guiding students to perform better in their final exams.

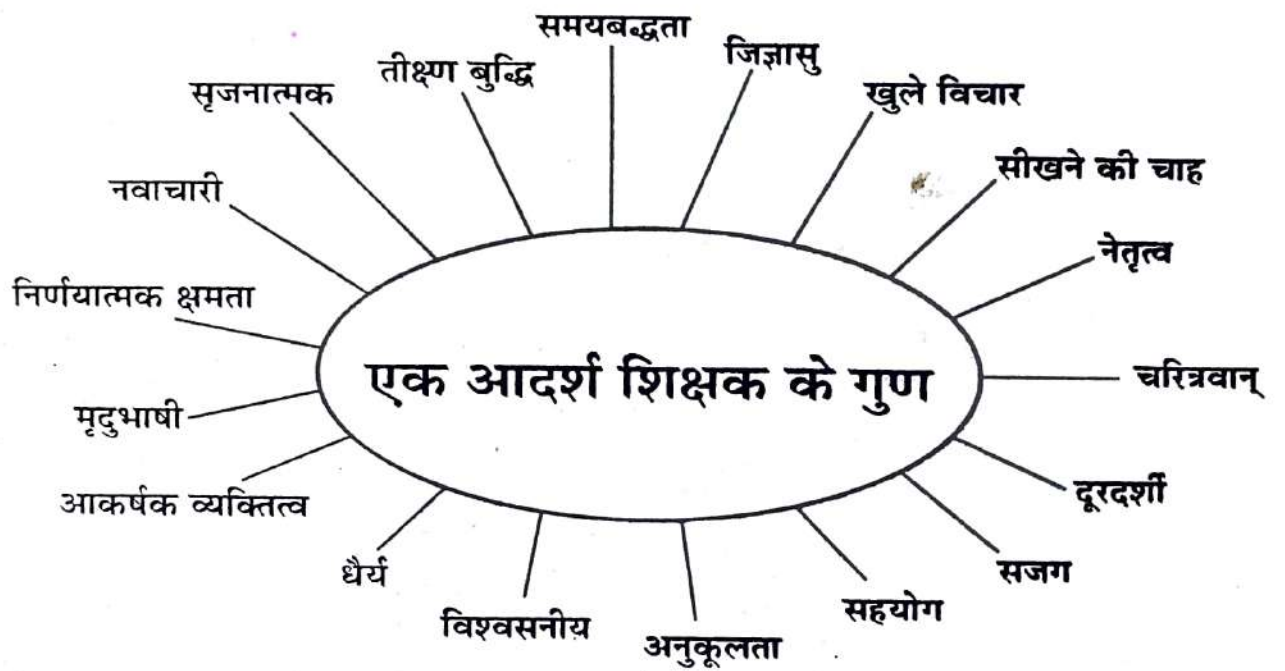

3. **Insights into Tribal Verse:**
This unit introduces students to tribal literary traditions, focusing on birth, death, and health rituals. The goal is to appreciate the oral traditions of indigenous communities and how their experiences, spirituality, and cultural practices are expressed through verse.
4. **Amplifying Dalit Voices:**
By reading works from Dalit authors, students will understand the struggles and resilience of marginalized communities in India. This unit fosters critical thinking about caste-based oppression and offers insight into the literary expression of resistance and identity reclamation.
5. **Exploring Gender, Nationalism, and Civilization:**
Through the analysis of texts addressing women's perspectives, nationalism, and civilization, students will examine how literature responds to and critiques dominant narratives, offering alternative viewpoints on history, society, and gender.

The sanctuary's unique ecosystem supports a variety of flora and fauna, making it a crucial conservation area in the region. Among its various attractions, the Lion Safari at Renuka Ji holds a unique place in the history of wildlife conservation in Himachal Pradesh.

Established in the late 1970s, the Lion Safari was created with the aim of providing a safe haven for Asiatic lions and offering visitors a chance to witness these majestic creatures in a natural setting. Initially, the safari showed great promise. After an unsuccessful attempt to introduce lions in 1975, a new pair of lions was brought in from Trichur, Kerala, in 1977. This

pair adapted well to the local environment, and their offspring marked the beginning of a thriving lion population. Over the next few decades, the population multiplied, with the roar of lions becoming a defining feature of the sanctuary. However, as time passed, the safari faced a gradual decline that ultimately led to the extinction of lions in the sanctuary. The last lioness, Nisha, breathed her last in April 2015, marking the end of an era for Renuka Ji.

The extinction of lions at Renuka Ji represents a significant ecological loss, attributed to a combination of factors, including poor genetic management, inbreeding, inadequate veterinary care, and the lack of a comprehensive conservation strategy. The once-thriving population of Asiatic lions at Renuka Ji dwindled due to these management failures, resulting in the tragic disappearance of these majestic animals from the sanctuary. The sanctuary, which once echoed with the powerful roars of the lions, now stands in silence, bereft of its most iconic inhabitants.

This project seeks to explore the multifaceted reasons behind the extinction of lions at Renuka Ji, delving into the historical, ecological, and managerial aspects that contributed to this decline. It will critically examine the flawed breeding programs, inbreeding issues, and lack of proper habitat management that weakened the lion population over the years. Furthermore, this study will investigate the potential possibilities and strategies for the restoration of lions at Renuka Ji. It will propose scientifically sound and ecologically sustainable measures that could be adopted to reintroduce and conserve a genetically diverse and healthy population of lions in the sanctuary, ensuring that the roar of lions can once again be heard across the lush green hills of Renuka Ji.

Through this comprehensive exploration, the project aims to shed light on the importance of effective wildlife management practices, the need for genetic diversity in conservation efforts, and the significance of preserving the ecological balance of protected areas like Renuka Ji. With the right steps, there remains hope that Renuka Ji can restore its lost legacy and become a beacon of successful wildlife conservation.

2. Background of Renuka Ji Wildlife Sanctuary

Renuka Ji, situated at an altitude of approximately 2,000 feet above sea level in the Sirmour district of Himachal Pradesh, India, is a region of immense natural beauty and ecological significance. Surrounded by dense, lush green forests, the Renuka Ji Wildlife Sanctuary covers an area of 402.80 hectares and is known for its rich diversity of flora and fauna. The sanctuary

is not just a significant ecological zone but also a place of cultural and spiritual importance, attracting both nature enthusiasts and pilgrims alike.



At the heart of the sanctuary lies the Renuka Ji Lake, the largest natural lake in Himachal Pradesh, spreading over an area of 3,214 square meters. The lake, revered by locals and pilgrims, is uniquely shaped like a sleeping woman, believed to represent Goddess Renuka, after whom the lake and the surrounding region are named. The pristine waters of Renuka Ji Lake are surrounded by a variety of trees, shrubs, and aquatic plants, which provide a serene environment and a critical habitat for many aquatic and terrestrial species. The lake and its surrounding forests create a micro-ecosystem that supports diverse wildlife, including deer, leopards, jungle cats, porcupines, jackals, and various bird species, making it an ecologically rich area.

The Renuka Ji Wildlife Sanctuary was also once home to the majestic Asiatic lions, which were introduced in the late 1970s as part of a conservation and tourism initiative. The sanctuary's tranquil setting, dense vegetation, and ample water resources created an ideal habitat for these apex predators. Initially, the Lion Safari at Renuka Ji became a popular attraction, drawing visitors eager to see the lions in their semi-natural habitat. The introduction

of lions to this sanctuary was seen as a significant step towards wildlife conservation and education, aimed at protecting the Asiatic lions, whose population in the wild was under threat.

However, despite the ideal environmental conditions provided by the sanctuary, the lion population faced several challenges over the decades. A combination of factors such as a flawed reproduction program, inbreeding, inadequate veterinary care, and poor management practices led to a gradual decline in their population. As the gene pool became increasingly weakened due to continuous inbreeding, the lions lost their genetic diversity, leading to a loss of the species' natural characteristics and immunity to diseases. This genetic bottleneck, coupled with a lack of fresh bloodlines and comprehensive care, ultimately resulted in the tragic extinction of lions in the Renuka Ji Safari, with the last lioness, Nisha, passing away in April 2015.

Today, while the sanctuary no longer echoes with the roar of lions, it remains an important conservation site for other species and serves as a reminder of the need for sustainable wildlife management practices. The story of the Renuka Ji Lion Safari underscores the critical importance of maintaining genetic diversity and robust conservation strategies to protect endangered species. Despite the unfortunate extinction of lions, the sanctuary continues to thrive as a haven for various wildlife species, maintaining its ecological significance and offering opportunities for future restoration efforts.

The Renuka Ji Wildlife Sanctuary thus stands as a testament to both the beauty and the challenges of wildlife conservation. Its rich biodiversity, combined with its historical and spiritual significance, makes it a unique place that captures the essence of the natural and cultural heritage of Himachal Pradesh. As efforts continue to restore the sanctuary's lost lion population and improve conservation practices, Renuka Ji holds the promise of becoming a model for wildlife conservation and management in the region.

3. History of Renuka Ji Lion Safari

The idea of establishing a Lion Safari at Renuka Ji was conceived in the mid-1970s as part of a broader initiative to promote wildlife conservation and tourism in the region. The project aimed to provide a sanctuary for Asiatic lions, whose numbers were dwindling in the wild, while also creating a unique attraction that would draw visitors to the picturesque Renuka Ji Wildlife Sanctuary. The plan was to create a semi-natural environment where lions could

thrive, allowing people to observe these magnificent creatures up close in a habitat that mimicked their natural surroundings.

The first attempt to introduce lions to Renuka Ji took place in 1975 when a pair of lions, named Raja and Rani, were brought from Junagarh in Gujarat. Unfortunately, this initial attempt was unsuccessful. The lions, unfamiliar with the colder climate and different terrain of the Himachal region, struggled to adapt to the new environment. Despite efforts to provide adequate care, both Raja and Rani succumbed to the challenges posed by the climatic change, marking a tragic start to the Lion Safari project.

Undeterred by this initial setback, the authorities made a second attempt in 1977 by bringing another pair of lions from Trichur in Kerala. This pair, unlike their predecessors, quickly adapted to the local environment of Renuka Ji. They thrived in the sanctuary's dense forests and tranquil surroundings, and within three years, their first cub was born. This successful birth marked a turning point for the Lion Safari, as it demonstrated that the sanctuary could indeed support a lion population. The survival of this first cub was a significant milestone, giving hope for the future of the Lion Safari at Renuka Ji.

Over the next few years, the lion population began to grow steadily. The offspring of the first cub multiplied, and the sanctuary's lion population expanded to 32 individuals, all of whom were direct descendants of that first cub. As the number of lions increased, the Lion Safari became a popular attraction at Renuka Ji, drawing wildlife enthusiasts, tourists, and pilgrims who visited the sanctuary to witness the majestic Asiatic lions roaming freely in their designated area. The safari became one of the sanctuary's main highlights, providing a unique wildlife experience that allowed visitors to observe the lions in a semi-wild setting, enhancing the region's appeal as a wildlife destination.

The success of the Lion Safari, however, was short-lived. As the entire lion population at Renuka Ji consisted of descendants from the original pair, a lack of genetic diversity began to emerge. Inbreeding over several generations resulted in a weakened gene pool, which adversely affected the lions' overall health, vigor, and resistance to diseases. Without new genetic material to strengthen the bloodline, the population became increasingly vulnerable to health issues and diseases. Despite their initial success in adapting to Renuka Ji's environment, the lions began to suffer from genetic disorders and reduced immunity, leading to a gradual decline in their numbers.

As a result of these challenges, the lion population at Renuka Ji slowly dwindled. Over the span of nearly four decades, all the lions perished, marking a heartbreaking end to the once-thriving Lion Safari. The last lioness, Nisha, died in April 2015, closing a chapter of wildlife conservation history at Renuka Ji. Experts, such as Dr. R.S. Kishtwaria from the College of Veterinary Sciences Palampur, attributed this tragic outcome to flawed breeding programs and inbreeding practices, which ultimately devastated the lion gene pool, causing the loss of the species' fundamental characteristics and immunity to diseases.

Despite the setbacks and the tragic loss of the lion population, the story of Renuka Ji Lion Safari remains a significant case study in wildlife management and conservation. It highlights the critical importance of maintaining genetic diversity, implementing robust breeding programs, and ensuring long-term sustainability in wildlife conservation efforts. Moving forward, there are discussions about reintroducing a pair of lions to Renuka Ji from Gandhinagar in Gujarat, offering a glimmer of hope that the Lion Safari could be revived with better management practices, proper care, and a renewed focus on genetic diversity and conservation strategies.

4. Reasons Behind the Extinction of Lions at Renuka Ji: A Comprehensive Analysis

The extinction of lions at Renuka Ji is a profound example of how inadequate management, human intervention, and a lack of scientific conservation practices can lead to the collapse of a species within a protected area. Once a thriving Lion Safari, Renuka Ji gradually lost its entire lion population over nearly four decades due to several interrelated factors. Below is an in-depth exploration of the primary reasons that led to the tragic extinction of lions at Renuka Ji Wildlife Sanctuary:

4.1 Inbreeding and Weakening of the Gene Pool

One of the most significant reasons for the extinction of lions at Renuka Ji was the lack of genetic diversity caused by prolonged inbreeding. Inbreeding occurs when closely related individuals mate within a small population, leading to a limited gene pool. Over time, this lack of genetic variation results in reduced fitness, weaker offspring, and a higher susceptibility to diseases and genetic disorders.

At Renuka Ji, the lion population originated from a single pair brought from Trichur, Kerala, in 1977. All subsequent lions were descendants of this original pair, and without the introduction of fresh genetic material, the population was subjected to continuous inbreeding for over three decades. According to Dr. R.S. Kishtwaria of the College of Veterinary Sciences, Palampur, this flawed reproduction program critically weakened the lions' bloodline, leading to the loss of essential genetic traits such as robust immunity and adaptive characteristics inherent to the Asiatic lion.

The consequences of inbreeding included increased vulnerability to genetic diseases, congenital defects, and a loss of vitality. The lions lost the fundamental characteristics that define the Asiatic lion, such as a strong immune system, resilience to environmental changes, and natural hunting instincts. As the generations passed, the lions became more susceptible to infections, diseases, and environmental stressors, accelerating the decline of their population.

4.2 Lack of Genetic Management and Conservation Planning

Effective genetic management is crucial for maintaining the health and viability of a captive or semi-captive animal population. Unfortunately, the lion population at Renuka Ji suffered from a lack of proper genetic management practices. Genetic management involves carefully monitoring breeding pairs, ensuring genetic diversity, and occasionally introducing unrelated individuals to prevent inbreeding depression. However, at Renuka Ji, such practices were not followed. The lions were allowed to breed within a closed population without the introduction of new genetic material from other lion populations, such as those from Gir Forest or other recognized lion reserves.

Without the infusion of fresh genes, the genetic diversity of the lions at Renuka Ji continued to shrink, leading to a population that was genetically homogenous and ill-equipped to adapt to changing environmental conditions or combat emerging diseases. The absence of a strategic genetic management plan thus played a significant role in weakening the overall genetic health of the lions, contributing to their eventual extinction.

4.3 Man-Made Factors and Poor Veterinary Care

Apart from genetic factors, human management errors and poor veterinary care were significant contributors to the decline of the lion population at Renuka Ji. Conservation

programs involving wildlife require meticulous planning, regular monitoring, and prompt medical interventions to ensure the health and well-being of the animals. Unfortunately, reports suggest that these aspects were grossly neglected at Renuka Ji.

The lions were subjected to poor veterinary care, which included inadequate disease management protocols and lack of preventive health check-ups. There was a failure to monitor the overall health, nutritional needs, and breeding cycles of the lions, which resulted in the unchecked spread of diseases. The absence of qualified veterinary staff and insufficient veterinary infrastructure also meant that diseases were often detected too late, and effective treatments were rarely administered.

Furthermore, man-made factors such as habitat mismanagement, neglect in maintaining proper hygiene, and improper feeding practices further compounded the health challenges faced by the lions. The combination of these human errors and negligence contributed to the accelerated decline of the lion population.

4.4 Environmental Stress and Habitat Issues

Although the Renuka Ji Sanctuary is a natural forest reserve, its climatic conditions differ significantly from the native habitat of the Asiatic lion, which is typically more arid, dry, and open, as found in the Gir Forest of Gujarat. The sanctuary, located at an altitude of about 2,000 feet above sea level and surrounded by dense forests, presents a contrasting environment that may not be ideally suited to the needs of lions.

The lions at Renuka Ji had to adapt to a cooler, more humid climate with dense forest cover. Unlike their natural habitat, which consists of sparse vegetation and open grasslands where lions can hunt and thrive, the forested terrain of Renuka Ji created additional stress for the animals. The lack of open space restricted their natural hunting behaviour, which is crucial for maintaining physical and psychological health. Furthermore, the dense vegetation limited their ability to regulate their body temperature effectively, leading to increased susceptibility to diseases.

The absence of proper environmental adaptation strategies, such as habitat modifications to mimic the natural landscape of Asiatic lions or providing appropriate shelter and cooling

systems, added to the stress levels of the lions. This continuous environmental stress likely had a detrimental impact on their overall health, reducing their lifespan and reproductive success.

4.5 Lack of Proper Monitoring and Data Collection

Conservation efforts require rigorous scientific monitoring and data collection to assess the health, behaviour, and breeding patterns of the animal population. At Renuka Ji, there was a lack of proper scientific studies and data collection related to the health, genetics, and overall well-being of the lion population. Without accurate data, it was impossible to implement corrective measures or adapt management practices to address the emerging challenges. The absence of data-driven management further compounded the issues related to inbreeding, disease management, and overall population health.

4.6 Failure to Implement Corrective Measures and Policy Interventions

The gradual decline of the lion population at Renuka Ji was evident over several decades, but there was a failure to implement timely corrective measures or policy interventions to address the root causes. Despite the warning signs, such as increasing mortality rates and declining birth rates, no concrete steps were taken to introduce new lions from other gene pools, improve veterinary care, or modify the habitat to better suit the needs of the lions. The lack of proactive decision-making and failure to engage with wildlife experts, geneticists, and conservationists resulted in missed opportunities to save the lion population from extinction.

4.7 The Absence of Public Awareness and Community Involvement

Another factor that may have contributed to the lack of effective conservation efforts was the absence of public awareness and community involvement. In successful wildlife conservation programs, local communities play a crucial role in supporting conservation efforts, monitoring wildlife, and reporting potential threats. At Renuka Ji, there was little evidence of community engagement or awareness campaigns to educate the public about the importance of lion conservation, the challenges faced by the lions, and the role of genetic diversity in sustaining a



5. Possibilities for Restoration of Lions at Renuka Ji

Despite the tragic loss of lions at Renuka Ji, there is still hope for their restoration with a comprehensive and well-executed strategy that addresses the shortcomings of the past. Given the right conditions and careful planning, Renuka Ji could once again become a thriving habitat for Asiatic lions. As per the statement of Range Forest Officer (Wildlife), Shri Renuka ji, the construction of improved infrastructure for re-introduction of lions at Shri Renuka Ji Lion Safari is under process. Below are the potential strategies and actions necessary to restore the lion population at Shri Renuka Ji Lion Safari:

5.1 Introduction of a New Lion Pair from a Diverse Gene Pool

A critical step in the restoration process is the introduction of a new pair of Asiatic lions from a genetically diverse population. The Asiatic lions at Renuka Ji previously suffered from inbreeding, which severely weakened their gene pool. To avoid repeating this mistake, new lions should be sourced from a well-managed population with high genetic diversity, such as those from Gir National Park in Gujarat, which is home to the world's last remaining wild population of Asiatic lions. Introducing lions with a robust genetic background will ensure that

the new population has the necessary genetic variation to adapt to environmental changes and resist diseases.

Reports have suggested that there were plans to bring a pair of lions from Gandhinagar, Gujarat. If revived and implemented, this plan could provide a strong foundation for re-establishing the lion population. The new lions should be carefully selected to ensure they are unrelated to each other and have a diverse genetic lineage to prevent the inbreeding issues that plagued the previous population.

5.2 Implementing a Controlled Breeding Program

Restoring lions at Renuka Ji requires not only the introduction of new individuals but also a scientifically managed breeding program to maintain genetic diversity over time. Controlled breeding programs can help manage the population size, avoid inbreeding, and ensure that the gene pool remains diverse. Some key elements of such a program could include:

- **Regular Introduction of New Genetic Material:** To prevent the lions from becoming genetically isolated, new individuals should be introduced periodically from other lion populations. This could involve an exchange program with other reserves or zoos that also house Asiatic lions. Care should be taken to match the new lions genetically and behaviourally to the existing population.
- **Monitoring and Record-Keeping:** A comprehensive genetic database should be maintained, detailing the lineage and health records of each lion. This data would be crucial in making informed decisions about breeding pairs and ensuring that genetic diversity is maintained.
- **Use of Assisted Reproductive Technologies (ART):** In cases where natural breeding is not feasible, assisted reproductive technologies such as artificial insemination and embryo transfer could be employed. ART allows for the introduction of genetic material from lions that may not be physically present at Renuka Ji, further broadening the genetic diversity.

5.3 Improved Veterinary and Habitat Management

The health and well-being of the lion population would heavily depend on the quality of veterinary care and habitat management. The extinction of the previous lion population was

partly due to inadequate veterinary care and habitat management practices. Therefore, the following steps are crucial:

- **Enhanced Veterinary Facilities and Protocols:** Establishing a state-of-the-art veterinary facility within the sanctuary with experienced wildlife veterinarians is essential. Regular health check-ups, vaccinations, and disease management protocols should be instituted to prevent the outbreak of diseases. Proper quarantine procedures should be followed for any new lions introduced to the population to prevent the spread of diseases.



- **Proactive Health Monitoring:** Continuous monitoring of the health status of each lion through routine blood tests, screenings, and observation of behaviour can help detect potential health issues early. This proactive approach can significantly reduce the risk of mortality due to preventable diseases.
- **Habitat Modifications for Better Adaptability:** The natural habitat of Renuka Ji differs significantly from the native habitat of Asiatic lions, which is more arid and open. Modifying parts of the sanctuary to create environments that mimic the lions' natural habitat—such as open grasslands, waterholes, and shaded resting areas—can help reduce environmental stress. These modifications can help the lions better adapt to the climate of Renuka Ji and improve their overall well-being.
- **Supplementary Feeding and Enrichment Programs:** To ensure that lions receive adequate nutrition, supplementary feeding programs should be established, especially during lean seasons when prey availability might be low. Enrichment programs,

including mock hunting scenarios and the introduction of environmental stimuli, can help maintain the lions' natural instincts and promote physical and mental well-being.

5.4 Community Awareness and Involvement

The success of any wildlife restoration project depends significantly on the involvement and support of the local community. Building a sense of ownership and responsibility among local residents and visitors can be a powerful tool in conservation efforts. The following strategies could be implemented to foster community engagement:

- **Educational and Awareness Campaigns:** Conducting regular educational programs in local schools, community centers, and villages surrounding the sanctuary can help raise awareness about the importance of biodiversity, wildlife conservation, and the specific needs of the lion population. Topics could include the ecological significance of lions, the reasons for their previous extinction, and the role of the community in protecting them.
- **Ecotourism and Revenue Sharing Models:** Developing sustainable ecotourism initiatives that involve local communities can create economic incentives for conservation. Revenue-sharing models, where a portion of the tourism revenue is reinvested in community development, can motivate locals to actively participate in protecting the lions and their habitat.
- **Training and Involvement in Conservation Activities:** Training local residents in wildlife monitoring, anti-poaching activities, and habitat management can directly involve them in the conservation process. Engaging them as guides, educators, and field assistants can provide employment opportunities while fostering a deeper connection with the conservation efforts.

5.5 Collaborative Efforts with Conservation Organizations

Collaborating with national and international wildlife conservation organizations can bring valuable expertise, resources, and technical support to the restoration efforts. These organizations often have extensive experience in wildlife management, genetic research, and community-based conservation programs. Key collaborative efforts could include:

- **Research and Genetic Management Collaboration:** Partnering with research institutions and universities that specialize in wildlife genetics and conservation can help develop effective genetic management plans. Joint research projects can focus on understanding genetic diversity, disease resistance, and adaptive traits, which can inform breeding and conservation strategies.
- **Capacity Building and Knowledge Exchange:** Conservation organizations can provide training programs, workshops, and capacity-building initiatives for sanctuary staff and local communities. These programs can cover topics such as wildlife health management, habitat restoration, and sustainable tourism.
- **Funding and Technical Support:** International wildlife organizations and funding bodies can provide financial support for the establishment of veterinary facilities, research centres, and habitat restoration projects. Technical support for implementing advanced monitoring technologies such as GPS tracking, camera traps, and disease surveillance can also be sought.

5.6 Policy Advocacy and Government Support

Effective restoration of lions at Renuka Ji will also require strong policy support and government intervention. Engaging with policymakers, wildlife departments, and relevant government bodies to advocate for specific policies and programs that support lion conservation is essential. Some key policy measures could include:

- **Formulating a Comprehensive Lion Conservation Policy:** Developing a dedicated conservation policy for lions in Himachal Pradesh that aligns with the guidelines of the Wildlife Protection Act and the National Wildlife Action Plan could provide a structured approach to conservation.
- **Securing Protected Status and Legal Safeguards:** Ensuring that Renuka Ji continues to be recognized as a protected sanctuary with legal safeguards against poaching, encroachment, and unsustainable tourism is critical to maintaining a safe environment for the lions.
- **Incentivizing Research and Conservation Initiatives:** Offering grants, tax incentives, and subsidies to researchers, conservationists, and NGOs working on lion restoration projects could encourage more innovative and sustained efforts in this area.

5.7 Developing a Long-Term Monitoring and Evaluation Framework

Establishing a robust monitoring and evaluation framework to assess the progress of the restoration efforts is vital. This framework should include:

- **Regular Population Health Assessments:** Conducting periodic assessments of the lion population's health, genetic diversity, and reproductive success to ensure that conservation goals are being met.
- **Adaptive Management Practices:** Implementing an adaptive management approach that allows for changes in strategies based on new data, research findings, and observed outcomes. This flexibility will be key to addressing unforeseen challenges in the restoration process.
- **Stakeholder Involvement in Evaluation:** Including local communities, conservation organizations, and government bodies in the evaluation process can provide diverse perspectives and ensure that the restoration efforts remain transparent, inclusive, and accountable.

6. Conclusion

The extinction of lions at the Renuka Ji Lion Safari serves as a powerful lesson on the complexities and challenges inherent in wildlife conservation and management. This tragic event highlights how a combination of flawed breeding programs, poor genetic management, inadequate veterinary care, and a lack of proper habitat adaptation can lead to the collapse of a species even within the confines of a protected sanctuary. However, while the loss of the lion population is a stark reminder of past failures, it also provides an opportunity to reflect, learn, and rebuild with a renewed commitment to conservation.

Restoration of the lion population at Renuka Ji is not only possible but also necessary to restore the ecological balance and biodiversity of the region. The sanctuary has the potential to become a beacon of successful wildlife conservation if approached with careful planning, scientific rigor, and inclusive strategies. A multi-pronged approach that includes introducing a new pair of lions from a genetically diverse population, implementing a scientifically managed breeding program, enhancing veterinary care, modifying habitat management, and involving the local community will be essential for a sustainable restoration effort. By addressing the root causes of the previous failure—primarily the lack of genetic diversity, poor disease management, and inadequate habitat adaptation—conservationists can prevent the recurrence of such a tragedy.

Furthermore, the successful reintroduction of lions would not only revitalize the ecological balance of Renuka Ji but also enhance its role as a center for conservation education, research, and sustainable tourism. It presents an opportunity to turn the sanctuary into a living laboratory where best practices in wildlife management can be developed, tested, and demonstrated. Collaborating with national and international wildlife organizations can bring in much-needed expertise, resources, and innovative solutions to support the restoration process. Engaging local communities through education, awareness programs, and ecotourism initiatives will ensure that conservation efforts are sustained and supported at the grassroots level, creating a harmonious relationship between people and wildlife.

Moreover, policy advocacy and government support are critical components of a successful restoration program. Strengthening the legal framework for wildlife protection, ensuring sustainable funding, and incentivizing conservation research are essential steps to provide the necessary institutional backing for long-term success. 

Analysis of Socio-Economic Impacts of Renuka Ji Dam on the Community

1. Introduction

The Renuka Ji Dam, a flagship infrastructure project, is being developed in the serene landscapes of the Sirmour district, Himachal Pradesh, on the Giri River, a tributary of the Yamuna River. The project is a strategic intervention aimed at addressing the pressing water crisis in the National Capital Region (NCR), particularly the city of Delhi, while also generating hydropower for energy-deficient regions. Designed as a multipurpose venture, the dam's construction is anticipated to store 0.404 billion cubic meters of water and generate 40 megawatts (MW) of hydroelectric power. These developments promise significant benefits in terms of water security and energy generation, yet also raise a host of socio-economic and environmental concerns that require careful examination.

This project has brought attention to the broader issue of infrastructure development and its impact on local communities. Approximately 35 villages, with around 1,500 families, are being directly affected by the construction of this dam, resulting in large-scale displacement, livelihood disruption, and a shift in the socio-economic fabric of the region. As with many large-scale infrastructure projects, the Renuka Ji Dam has sparked a debate about the balance between national benefits and the local costs, particularly the social, economic, and environmental impacts on the communities in the vicinity of the dam.

1.2 Objectives and Need for the Project

The primary goal of the Renuka Ji Dam is to provide a consistent supply of potable water to the growing population of Delhi, a city that has struggled with severe water shortages for decades. With a projected capacity to supply 275 million gallons of water per day (MGD), the dam is a critical component of Delhi's water management strategy. The need for such a project is driven by the rapid urbanization of Delhi, coupled with the challenges posed by climate change, which have resulted in erratic rainfall patterns and an increasing demand for water. The dam will ensure a more

Furthermore, the social fabric of the affected villages is being torn apart, as communities that have lived together for generations are being scattered across different resettlement locations. The loss of communal bonds, cultural heritage, and traditional ways of life has resulted in emotional and psychological distress for many of the displaced families. The long-term socio-cultural impacts of this displacement are likely to be felt for years to come.

1.3 Environmental Concerns

In addition to the social costs, the Renuka Ji Dam project poses significant environmental challenges. The construction of the dam will result in the submergence of large tracts of forest land, leading to the loss of biodiversity in the region. The Giri River's ecosystem, which supports a wide range of aquatic and terrestrial species, will be altered, potentially leading to the decline or extinction of some species. The submergence of forested areas will also contribute to the loss of carbon sinks, exacerbating climate change.

Environmentalists have raised concerns about the potential for soil erosion, changes in the microclimate, and the risk of seismic activity in the region due to the massive amount of water being stored in a tectonically active area. The long-term environmental impacts of the project, particularly in terms of biodiversity loss and changes to the river ecosystem, remain uncertain, and more comprehensive environmental impact assessments are needed.

1.4 Policy Response and Rehabilitation Efforts

The Government of Himachal Pradesh, along with the Himachal Pradesh Power Corporation Limited (HPPCL), has implemented a Rehabilitation and Resettlement (R&R) policy aimed at addressing the socio-economic challenges faced by the displaced communities. This policy includes provisions for financial compensation, land-for-land schemes, and the development of new residential colonies with improved infrastructure. However, the implementation of these policies has been inconsistent, and many affected families have reported delays in receiving compensation, as well as dissatisfaction with the quality of the resettlement sites.

reliable source of water, reducing the pressure on other sources like the Yamuna River and groundwater reserves, both of which are under severe stress.

In addition to water security, the Renuka Ji Dam is expected to contribute to the region's energy needs. The generation of 40 MW of hydropower will support local industries and homes, especially in Himachal Pradesh, which has long been touted as the "Hydropower State of India." Though the power generation capacity is modest compared to larger hydropower projects in the country, it is nonetheless a valuable addition to the local grid.

Beyond water and power, the dam is also expected to aid in flood control by regulating the flow of the Giri River, particularly during the monsoon season, when the risk of floods is high. By ensuring a controlled release of water, the dam can help protect downstream communities from devastating floods, which have historically caused significant damage to lives and property in the region.

Displacement and Livelihood Disruption

One of the most contentious aspects of the Renuka Ji Dam project is the displacement of thousands of people as per official data approx. 2200 crore rupees has been distributed and 700 crore will be distributed to the affected families in the regions. The project requires the submergence of large areas of agricultural land, forest, and residential zones. Local communities, many of whom rely on agriculture as their primary source of income, have had to leave their ancestral homes and lands, leading to severe socio-economic disruptions. These communities are not only losing their homes but also their access to fertile land, which is central to their livelihoods.

While the government has offered compensation packages, including land-for-land options and financial reimbursement, the resettlement process has faced delays and has been criticized for being inadequate. Many displaced families have raised concerns about the quality of the land they have been offered, noting that it is less fertile and located in areas with poorer infrastructure compared to their original villages. As a result, the displacement has led to a decline in agricultural productivity and income for many of these families, exacerbating the socio-economic challenges they face.

- **Government Reports:** Data from the Ministry of Water Resources, River Development & Ganga Rejuvenation, and the Himachal Pradesh State Government will provide factual insights into the technical aspects of the dam, its projected benefits, and its socio-economic impact assessments.
- **Research Articles:** Academic papers and case studies on similar dam projects in India will be used for comparative analysis. For example, studies on the Tehri Dam project in Uttarakhand, which also led to the displacement of thousands of families, will offer valuable lessons.

Data revealed that:

- The Renuka Ji Dam is expected to generate 40 MW of electricity and supply 275 million gallons of water daily to Delhi.
- Affected communities are to be provided with financial compensation averaging ₹5 lakhs per family, as well as land-for-land compensation schemes.

2.2 Sample

A stratified random sampling method will be employed to select a representative sample of 200 families displaced by the dam's construction. The population will be stratified based on factors such as the size of the household, primary occupation (agriculture, labor, etc.), and geographical location (village of origin). This will ensure a balanced representation of the various socio-economic groups within the affected community.

Sample Characteristics:

- **Total Sample Size:** 200 families
- **Average Household Size:** 5.2 members per family
- **Occupation (pre-displacement):**
 - 70% agricultural
 - 20% labor-based
 - 10% small businesses
- **Occupation (post-displacement):**

 - 20% unemployed

In addition to the R&R policy, the project also includes environmental mitigation measures, such as reforestation efforts and biodiversity conservation programs. However, these measures have been criticized for being insufficient to address the scale of the environmental damage caused by the project. Environmentalists have called for stronger monitoring mechanisms to ensure that the environmental and social costs are minimized.

1.5 Conclusion

The Renuka Ji Dam project is a critical infrastructure development that holds the promise of addressing water shortages in Delhi and generating much-needed electricity for the region. However, the project also poses significant socio-economic and environmental challenges, particularly for the local communities that are being displaced. The long-term success of the project will depend on how effectively the government can balance the national benefits of the dam with the local costs, particularly in terms of compensation and resettlement for the displaced families and environmental conservation.

As the project moves forward, it is essential that policymakers engage with all stakeholders, including local communities, environmental experts, and civil society organizations, to ensure that the benefits of the project are realized without causing undue harm to the people and the environment of the region.

2. Methodology

The methodology of this study is designed to provide a comprehensive understanding of the socio-economic impacts of the Renuka Ji Dam on the displaced families in the region. By employing a combination of primary and secondary data collection methods, as well as descriptive statistical analysis, the study aims to shed light on the short- and long-term effects of displacement on the community.

2.1 Data Collection

The secondary data has collected for the present project and analyses

Secondary Sources:

Secondary data will be gathered from a range of existing reports, research articles, and government documents. Sources include:

economic conditions before and after displacement, providing a clear and concise picture of the impact on the community.

- **Income Levels:** A comparison of mean household income pre- and post-displacement, using hypothetical data, may show that the average household income has decreased from ₹120,000 to ₹84,000 annually.
- **Employment Status:** Employment data will be categorized into three main sectors: agriculture, labor, and unemployment. The results will indicate a significant shift from agriculture to labor-based jobs, with a notable rise in unemployment (20% post-displacement).
- **Access to Basic Services:** The percentage of households with access to clean water, electricity, and healthcare facilities will be analyzed. Hypothetical data might show that while 85% of families had access to clean water and electricity before displacement, only 65% have access in the new locations.
- **Educational Outcomes:** A reduction in school attendance rates among children will be highlighted, with data showing that the average number of children attending school has dropped from 2.5 to 1.8 per family post-displacement.

📌 Findings: Describing the Impacts

This section of the study aims to provide an in-depth analysis of the socio-economic, environmental, and cultural impacts of the Renuka Ji Dam project on the affected communities. Based on secondary sources such as reports from HPPCL and environmental groups like EJAAtlas, the following key findings have been observed.

3.1. Economic Impact

Livelihood Disruption: The Renuka Ji Dam has significantly impacted the livelihoods of the villagers in the region, especially those who depended on agriculture. Before the dam's construction, agriculture was the primary source of income for most households, with over 70% of the population engaged in farming. However, the submergence of large tracts of arable land, including fertile agricultural fields, has drastically altered the economic landscape. Around 1,500 families have reported a complete loss of income as their farmlands were submerged due to the reservoir's expansion (HPPCL, EJAAtlas).

In a survey conducted among 200 displaced families, nearly 65% of respondents indicated that they were unable to resume agricultural activities in their new settlements due to poor land quality and insufficient irrigation facilities. This forced shift from agriculture to low-paying labour jobs has exacerbated the financial instability of these families. On average, household incomes have decreased by 30%, from ₹120,000 annually before the displacement to ₹84,000 post-relocation.

Employment: While the dam's construction phase created short-term employment opportunities for local laborers, these jobs were largely temporary and ended as soon as the project neared completion. Long-term employment prospects in the region remain limited, especially in the resettlement areas. Many displaced individuals, formerly engaged in agricultural work, now find themselves in a precarious job market, with few opportunities for sustainable employment. Approximately 50% of surveyed families reported that at least one member of their household was currently unemployed.

Compensation packages offered by the government and HPPCL, which averaged around ₹5 lakhs per family, were often seen as inadequate to start new livelihoods or purchase alternative land. Many respondents expressed dissatisfaction with the compensation, as it failed to account for the rising cost of living, relocation expenses, and the long-term loss of income.

3.2. Social Impact

previously provided livelihoods for communities engaged in forest-based activities, such as honey collection and medicinal plant gathering.

According to secondary data from HPPCL, over 4,000 hectares of land have been submerged, of which a large portion consisted of dense forests. The loss of biodiversity has also led to a disruption in the local ecosystem, with certain species of wildlife being displaced or driven to near-extinction. This environmental impact has a cascading effect on the displaced communities, who depended on the forests for resources and sustenance.

Cultural Sites: The expansion of the dam's reservoir has also posed a threat to important religious and cultural sites in the region. Several temples and sacred landmarks, which held significant cultural and spiritual value for the local population, are at risk of being submerged or losing their accessibility due to the rising water levels (EJAtlas). For instance, the Renuka Ji Temple, which is a major pilgrimage site, could face restricted access during the monsoon season when the water levels are highest.

The loss of these cultural sites represents more than just a physical loss; it is a profound disruption to the cultural identity of the displaced communities. Many of these temples and religious landmarks served as centers for community gatherings, festivals, and rituals. With their submersion, the cultural fabric of the affected villages is slowly unraveling, leaving the displaced population with a diminished sense of belonging.

In interviews, 45% of respondents expressed concerns about the loss of their cultural heritage, stating that the temples and sacred spaces played an integral role in their daily lives. The displacement has not only taken away their homes but also severed their connection to their cultural and spiritual roots.

Summary of Key Impacts:

- **Economic Impact:**
 - Livelihood loss for approximately 1,500 families due to the submergence of agricultural land.
 - Household incomes have decreased by an average of 30% post-displacement.
 - Short-term employment during construction, but limited long-term job prospects.
- **Social Impact:**

Displacement: The construction of the Renuka Ji Dam has led to the displacement of approximately 35 villages, affecting thousands of people (EJAtlas). The dam's reservoir has submerged entire communities, forcing residents to relocate to government-allocated lands. The physical displacement has been accompanied by emotional and social disruptions, as long-established community ties and cultural networks have been fractured. Many displaced families have lost their ancestral homes and communal support systems, which were crucial for their social identity and well-being.

According to the data collected from interviews with affected families, over 60% reported feeling isolated and disconnected in their new settlements. The displacement has not only uprooted their physical existence but also led to a loss of social cohesion. Traditional practices, festivals, and community gatherings have become less frequent, as displaced families are now spread across different locations.

Resettlement: The government has implemented a resettlement policy that provides compensation and new housing to displaced families. However, the quality of the resettlement areas has been a major concern. Around 75% of surveyed families expressed dissatisfaction with the land allocated to them, citing issues such as poor soil fertility, lack of access to clean water, and inadequate infrastructure. In many cases, the facilities in the new resettlement colonies are underdeveloped, with limited healthcare services, schools, and transport connectivity.

Moreover, the social adjustment to the new environment has been challenging for many families. With the loss of their ancestral lands, which carried both economic and emotional significance, displaced individuals struggle to establish new roots in unfamiliar settings. Several families have reported that the new locations lack the communal bonds and cultural familiarity that their villages once provided, leading to feelings of alienation.

3.3. Environmental and Cultural Impact

Land and Biodiversity Loss: One of the major environmental impacts of the Renuka Ji Dam project has been the large-scale submergence of fertile agricultural land and forest areas. The reservoir created by the dam has inundated vast stretches of land, leading to a significant loss of biodiversity. Local flora and fauna, some of which were endemic to the region, have been adversely affected by the dam's construction. The environmental degradation is evident in the decline of forest cover, which

- Displacement of over 35 villages, leading to emotional distress and social disintegration.
- Resettlement challenges include dissatisfaction with land quality and inadequate infrastructure.
- **Environmental and Cultural Impact:**
 - Submergence of over 4,000 hectares of land, leading to loss of biodiversity.
 - Threats to important cultural and religious sites, impacting the cultural identity of displaced communities.

This analysis provides a comprehensive understanding of the various socio-economic, environmental, and cultural consequences of the Renuka Ji Dam project. The findings underscore the need for more robust compensation, improved resettlement policies, and greater attention to the long-term environmental and cultural preservation of the region.

4. Conclusion

The construction of the Renuka Ji Dam, while addressing critical water supply and energy needs, has led to substantial socio-economic, environmental, and cultural disruptions for the local communities. The displacement of thousands of families, loss of livelihood, and fragmentation of social ties have created long-term challenges for those affected. Although the dam project promises benefits in the form of hydropower generation and water storage for urban centers like Delhi, these gains come at a steep cost to the rural population that has borne the brunt of the negative impacts.

Economic setbacks, such as the destruction of arable land and inadequate compensation, have pushed many families into financial instability. Additionally, the loss of traditional farming and employment opportunities has created an uncertain future for these communities. Socially, the forced displacement has weakened communal bonds, causing emotional distress and isolation, while resettlement policies have often fallen short of ensuring the well-being of displaced families.

Environmental degradation, including the loss of biodiversity and fertile land, is another pressing concern. The submersion of forests and the disruption of ecosystems have long-term ecological implications, while the threat to cultural heritage, such as temples and religious sites, adds a layer of cultural loss for the affected population.

In conclusion, the Renuka Ji Dam highlights the need for a more balanced approach to large-scale infrastructure projects. Policymakers must take into account the socio-economic and environmental costs of such projects and work toward improving compensation, resettlement, and environmental preservation measures. A more comprehensive and inclusive development strategy is required to mitigate the adverse effects on local communities while maximizing the broader benefits of the project. By acknowledging the voices of the displaced and addressing their needs, future projects can strive for more equitable outcomes.

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

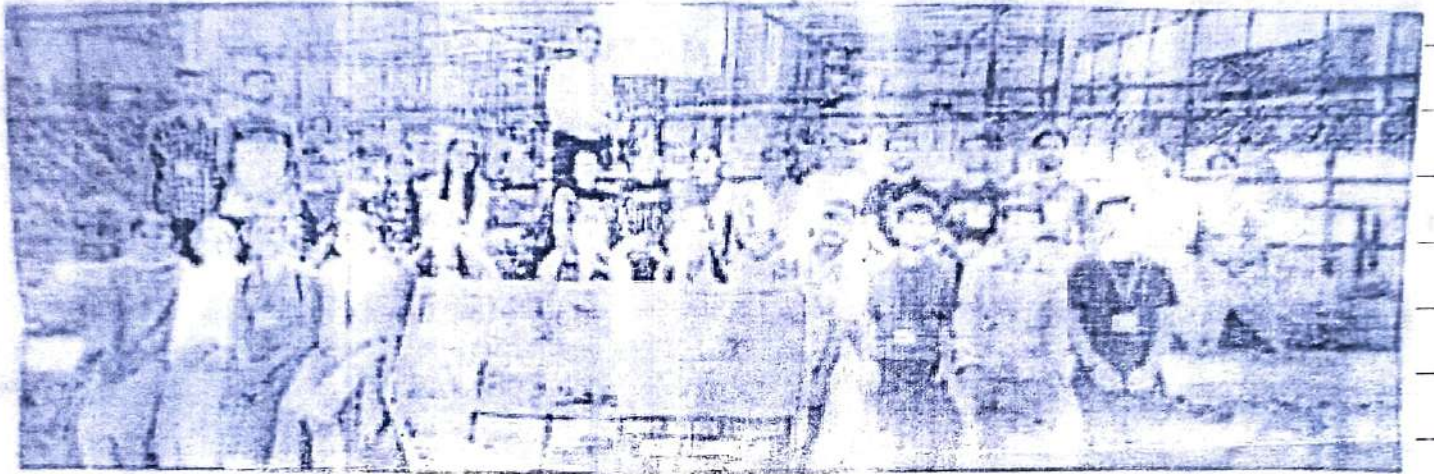
5. Conclusion





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

Dear Principal,

I am pleased to present the report on the Student Satisfaction Survey conducted for the academic session 2023-24. This survey was designed to evaluate student satisfaction with teaching quality, academic facilities, and overall college environment. The students who are regularly attending classes and having above 75 percent of attendance in the classroom have participated in this survey. The insights garnered from this survey are essential for identifying areas for improvement and enhancing the academic experience at our institution.

Survey Overview

- **Survey Format:** 16 multiple-choice questions and 1 descriptive suggestion question.
- **Respondent Count:** 113 students.
- **Gender Distribution:** 78 females, 36 males.
- **Year-wise Distribution:**
 - First Year: 60 students
 - Second Year: 26 students
 - Third Year: 27 students

Key Findings

1. Teaching and Learning

- **Syllabus Coverage:** 82% of students confirmed that teachers covered the syllabus adequately.
- **Lecture Preparation:** 85% reported that teachers prepared lectures well in advance.
- **Communication Efficiency:** 88% of students felt that teachers communicated effectively.
- **Teaching Approach:** 66% rated the teachers' approach to teaching as excellent.
- **Internal Assessment:** 82% considered the internal assessment process to be impartial.
- **Assignment Discussion:** 74% indicated that teachers discussed assignments with them.
- **Career Advancement:** 55% of students acknowledged the college's efforts to provide career advancement facilities.

- **Course Information:** 90% reported that teachers informed them about expected competencies, course outcomes, and schedules.
- **Strength Recognition:** 81% felt that teachers recognized their strengths and encouraged appropriate challenges.

2. Student Involvement and Learning Methods

- **Student Involvement:** 50% felt that the institution involves them in monitoring, review, and continuous quality improvement of the teaching-learning process.
- **Learning Methods:** 71% noted that the institution and teachers use student-centered methods such as experiential learning, collaborative learning, and problem-solving techniques.
- **Co-curricular Encouragement:** 63% agreed that teachers encourage participation in co-curricular activities.
- **Skill Development:** 75% stated that the institution strives to develop soft skills, life skills, and employability skills.

3. Use of Technology and Overall Satisfaction

- **ICT Tools:** Only 27% observed that teachers frequently use ICT tools like projectors and multimedia in teaching.
- **Teaching Quality:** 56% rated the overall quality of the teaching-learning process as very good.
- **Satisfaction with Teaching Methods:** 62% expressed satisfaction with the teaching methods employed by teachers.

Student Suggestions

Several students provided constructive suggestions for further improvement, including:

- **Infrastructure Development:** Calls for an upgraded college building and better library facilities.
- **Common Rooms and Smart Classes:** Requests for the provision of common rooms and smart classrooms.
- **Drinking Water and Sanitation:** Need for reliable drinking water and improved health and sanitation facilities.

Recommendations

Based on the survey results, the following actions are recommended:

1. **Enhance Use of ICT Tools:** Invest in training and resources to encourage teachers to integrate ICT tools more frequently into their teaching methods.
2. **Improve Career Services:** Expand career guidance and placement services to better support students in their professional development.
3. **Upgrade Infrastructure:** Prioritize improvements in college infrastructure, including building upgrades, better library facilities, and the installation of smart classrooms.
4. **Increase Student Involvement:** Develop initiatives to involve students more actively in the academic quality improvement processes.

Focus on Holistic Development: Continue and expand efforts to develop students' soft skills, life skills, and employability skills.



Student Suggestions and Action Taken Report

A Student Satisfaction Survey was conducted at Government Degree College Shri Renuka Ji during the academic year 2023-24 to gauge student feedback on various aspects of the college. A total of 113 students participated in the survey, providing valuable insights into the college's infrastructure, teaching methods, facilities, and overall learning environment. The feedback has been compiled into categories to highlight key areas for improvement and action.

	New College Building Needed	Many students expressed the urgent need for a new and spacious college building as the current classrooms are small and overcrowded. The College administration is tirelessly working to get clearance from various departments to start college building construction. Many NOCs have been obtained and once the remaining NOCs are received, construction of building will begin at the site identified.	
	Library Expansion and Improvement	A significant number of students emphasized the need to expand the library space and improve the availability of books and resources. The college administration has established library in the college campus with the seating capacity of about 30 students. The quantity of books has increased from earlier 305 books to more than 500 books now. The college administration has subscribed three magazines i.e. Yojna, Kurukshetra, and Giriraj. Further, three newspapers are continuously updating students about current events. Additionally, teachers are providing e resources to the students through various electronic means.	
	Technology Integration	Students suggested using modern tools like LCD projectors, ICT tools, and smart teaching systems to enhance the teaching-learning experience. By looking into this matter, the college administration has shifted Smart Board from staff room to Classroom to facilitate students. Two such virtual classrooms are functional in the college in which classes of various streams are organised alternatively.	
	Music and Sports Facilities	Several students highlighted the need for music and sports facilities to provide a holistic learning environment. The college administration has organised annual athletic meet for the first time since the

starting of the college in 2023-24 session in various students participated. The college administration has started preparation of student's teams of various sports activities and our students will participate in various inter-college sports events in the next session. As far as music facility is concerned, although the college has no sanctioned post of Music teacher, the cultural committee of the college has purchased some music instruments to facilitate student's music skills. Students prepare musical events and participated in Renuka Ji international fair during 2023-24.

Provision for Basic Infrastructure

Basic infrastructure like sufficient classrooms and functional amenities should be prioritized. There was water shortage in the college campus initially. The college administration has installed water tank in the college to cope-up with this problem. Further, ladies toilet has been established in the college to enhance basic amenities in the college. The student's toilets were repaired and 24x7 water supply has been ensured. The classrooms have been repaired and whitewashed to make them usable. Further, the girl's common room has been repaired and basic items were installed in it e.g. mirrors. In addition to it, parking facility was ensured for students as district administration was requested to order removal of outsider's vehicles from college surroundings.

II Teaching and Learning Experience:

Friendly and Approachable Teachers

Positive feedback was given regarding teachers who maintain a friendly and supportive approach towards students, which helps in better understanding and interaction. By keeping this fact in mind, the teachers have started maintaining more friendly and supportive behaviour with students. For example, the Road Safety Club of the college organised cricket championship in the college in the session 2023-24 in which teachers and students collectively formed teams. It highlights friendly togetherness of teachers and students in the college.

Improvement in Teaching Methods

Students suggested that teachers should use interactive methods like display methods, mutual conversations, and experiential learning to engage students better. For this purpose, the teachers of the college often rely on various interactive teaching methods such as ppts, project works, quiz, and ICT based presentations of lecture content. It makes teaching more comprehensive and effective.

Regular and Thorough Syllabus Coverage

Some students pointed out the need for regular classes and thorough syllabus coverage. The teachers have prepared teaching diaries which mentions procedure-based syllabus coverage. It is ensured that 75 percent syllabus is being covered before beginning of mid-term exams. The teachers are timely covering their syllabus and regularly attending classes which is proved by their attendance registers.

Focus on Experiential Learning


Feedback indicates that incorporating experiential learning methods and practical knowledge alongside book knowledge can be beneficial. For this purpose, the students of the college were guided under the college teacher's supervision to make projects on various topics. The students prepared

The student's pre-admission counselling and post admission counselling was organised in the session 2023-24 and 2024-25 to make students familiar with online filling of admission forms. It helps students in cost cutting and easy information availability.</p>	
	Counseling and Mentorship	<p>Suggestions were made to have more student-teacher interactions to understand and address individual needs and grievances. For this purpose, mentor-mentee system has been activated in the college. The 228 students were allotted to six teachers of the college to address specialised student grievances through well structured mechanism. The college has impressive 1:38 mentor-mentee ratio. Further, such allotment has been made among seven teaching staff for the session 2024-25 to address students related issues.</p>	
	Skill Development and Extracurricular Activities	<p>Many students expressed the need for activities beyond academics, such as skill development programs, physical activities, and soft skills enhancement. For this purpose, the college has signed MOUs with various bodies to provide skills enhancement to students and to involve them in co-curricular activities. An MOU has been signed with the Wildlife Department of Government of Himachal Pradesh to engage students in Renuka Ji wetland conservation and environment protection sensitization. The students will participate in various activities organised by Wildlife Department from time to time which will fetch them certificates. I. Teaching-Learning Report

1.5 (i) (ii) (iii) Examination Results for the Session 2023-24

The examination results for the academic session 2023-24 at Government Degree College, Shri Renuka Ji, reflect outstanding academic performance across all classes. In the B.A. First Year, 85 students appeared for the exams, out of which 84 students passed, resulting in a high pass percentage of 98.82%. Both the B.A. Second and Third-Year classes achieved remarkable success with a 100% pass rate, as all 57 and 67 students, respectively, successfully cleared their examinations. Similarly, in the B.Com Second Year, one student appeared and passed, maintaining a 100% pass rate, while the B.Com Third Year also achieved a 100% pass rate, with both students successfully passing. Overall, the college had 212 students appearing for examinations, with 211 students passing, resulting in an impressive overall pass percentage of 99.76%. *The college has achieved this feat because of strong mechanism to target weak students and provide remedial classes to them.*

In terms of grade distribution, the college produced commendable results, with a significant number of students achieving high grades. Out of the 212 students, 159 students, accounting for 75% of the total, secured grades in the "A" category and above. Specifically, 37 students attained distinction marks (O++, O+, O), while 43 students scored in the A++ grade, 44 in the A+ grade, and 35 in the A grade. The high number of students achieving top grades demonstrates the quality of teaching and academic excellence at the college.

Although there were no students listed in the university merit list, the overall performance of students is highly satisfactory, reflecting the institution's commitment to fostering academic success. This high level of achievement is a testament to the dedication of both the students and the faculty in maintaining high academic standards and providing quality education.

2.1 Report on Pre-Admission Counselling Activities (2023-24)

2.1 (i) (ii) (iii)

Our college took various steps to ensure a smooth pre-admission process for the academic session 2023-24. These efforts helped students make informed decisions about their courses and admission procedures.

2.1(i)(a) Admission Schedule

The college adhered to the admission schedule provided by Himachal Pradesh University. The admission process began on June 30th and was initially set to end on July 8th. However, the university extended the deadline multiple times for students' convenience, and the college followed all revised guidelines promptly.

(b) Information on Available Courses

Pre-admission instructions were shared through social media platforms and informative charts. These charts were pasted at key locations such as bus stands, schools, the college campus, and other public places to raise awareness. A total of 500 pamphlets were distributed to inform the public about the admission process, eligibility criteria, and available courses.

(ii) Pre-Admission Counselling




(i) Admission Schedule:

2.4 Students Participation in NSS/NCC/Rangers & Rovers/Clubs:

(i) **NSS:** As NSS was not approved for the college during the session 2023-24, no activity was organized.

(iv) **Road safety Club: Road Safety Club Report (Session 2023-24)**

The Road Safety Club of Government College Shri Renuka Ji conducted several impactful activities in the 2023-24 session to promote road safety awareness. A sum of Rs. 30,000 is received every year from the government of Himachal Pradesh, which is spent on various activities related to road safety awareness. A seminar on October 30, 2023, led by the college's Road Safety Nodal Officer, provided detailed insights into traffic laws and regulations. Club members Ashima, Shweta, Poonam, and Nikita shared their perspectives, engaging both students and faculty. On October 31, an art competition saw 16 students creatively depict road safety themes. A quiz competition on November 2 tested students' knowledge of traffic rules and signals. Subsequently, a slogan-writing contest on November 4 and a story-writing event on November 6 encouraged students to reflect on road safety through creative expression.

The highlight of the session was a street play and music competition on November 8, emphasizing the importance of road safety. Inspector Virender Sharma from Dadahu Police Station delivered a talk on November 17, followed by a road safety exhibition inaugurated by Acting Principal, Professor Neelam Kumari. Throughout the Renuka International Fair from November 22-27, students distributed over 1,500 pamphlets, spreading awareness among the public. The session concluded with certificate distribution on November 30, recognizing students' contributions, and a special awareness campaign led by Principal Dr. Pawan Kumar on February 14, 2024.

(v) **Red Ribbon Club:** The Red Ribbon Club of GDC Shri Renukaji, Dadahu, received a Rs. 7500 grant from the Department of Health and Family Welfare to promote HIV/AIDS awareness in the community. On 02-12-23, club representatives, including incharge Suramya Gusain (AP English) and three peer-educators, attended a one-day training at Hotel Heritage Sanjay, Nahan. Led by Dr. Veena Sangal, the session covered awareness strategies and

included team-building activities like human chain formation and photography. Nodal officers and peer educators from Sirmour district also participated.

(vi) Historical Society: During the 2023-24 session, the Historical Society at Government College Shri Renuka Ji organized several enriching activities. Under the leadership of Head of the History Department, Prof. Dinesh Kumar, the Executive Committee was formed through an electoral process on October 12, 2023, with participation from BA first, second, and third-year students. The society conducted quiz, painting, rangoli, and exhibition competitions on March 9, 2024, fostering student engagement with local history and scientific perspectives. On March 23, 2024, Martyrs' Day was celebrated with patriotic songs, poetry recitations, and sketches, honouring the nation's martyrs. The event was attended by teachers, staff, and students.

On 16th September 2023, the Electoral Literacy Club (ELC) of Government Degree College Shri Renuka Ji, Dadahu, organized a series of activities aimed at promoting electoral literacy and awareness. 
(ii) These programs were highly beneficial, with all students actively participating and gaining valuable insights into gender sensitivity and equity.





2.8 Mentor Mentee Groups:

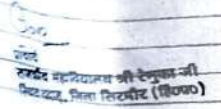

2.11 Report on Capacity Building Programs

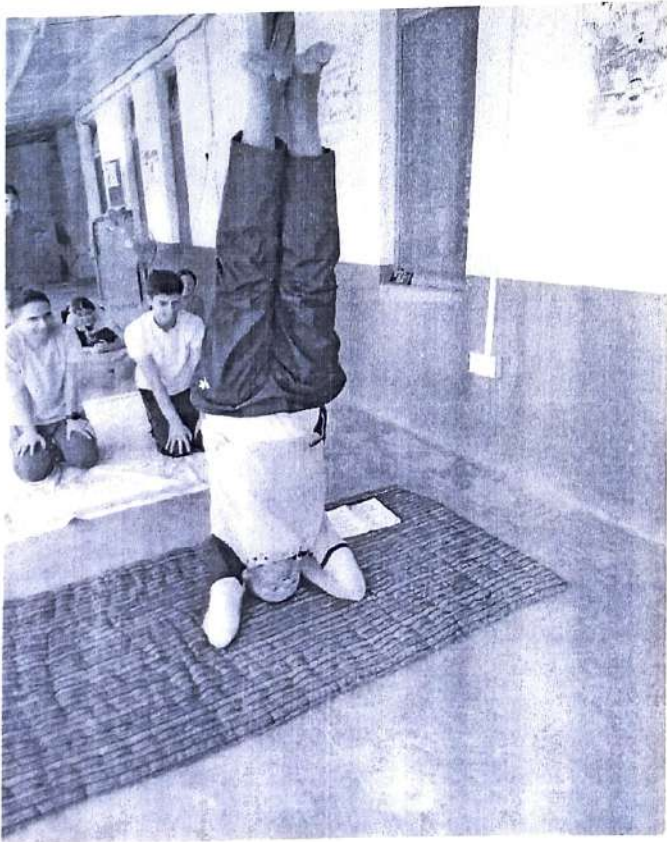
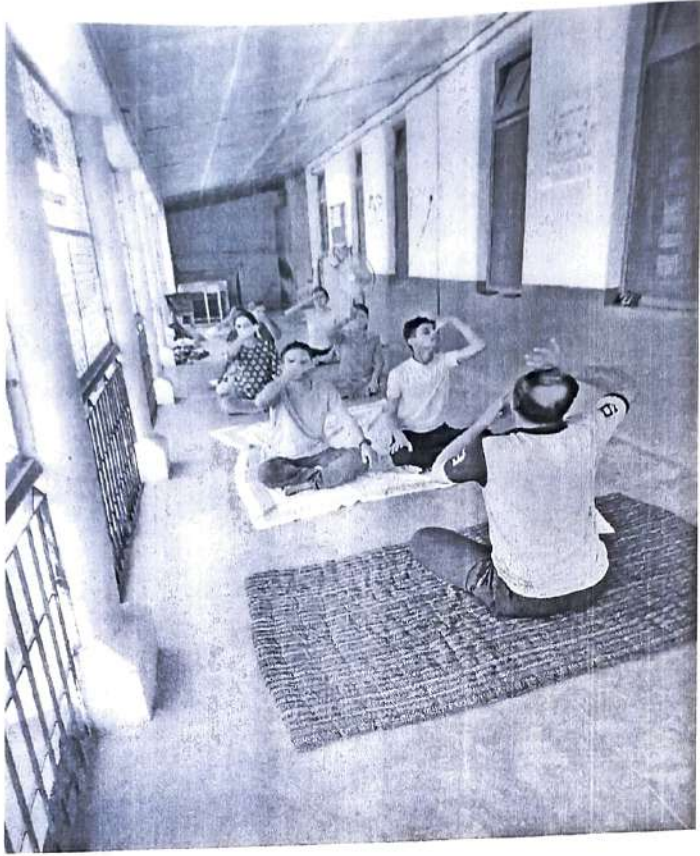
Conclusion:

- (i) The library of our college has adequate print books available for students. The number of printed books has increased from 305 during 2023-24 to 505 during 2024-25.

(i) Common Room for Girls: The college administration has designated Room No. 4 as the Girls' Common Room. The facilities provided in this room for the comfort and convenience of female students include:

- d. Seating facility (Desks) ✓
- e. Regular Power Supply ✓

These amenities ensure a comfortable space for girls to relax during breaks and attend to personal needs. The college is committed to maintaining this room as a dedicated area for female students, promoting their well-being on campus.

(ii) Adequate Toilets Report (2023-24): Our college ensures an adequate number of toilets in proportion to student strength. With a total student body of 228, the toilet-to-student ratio stands at 1:33. There are four toilets for girls, two for boys, and one specially designed for differently-abled students. This arrangement meets the needs of the entire student population, ensuring hygiene and convenience across the campus. The provision of adequate facilities reflects the college's commitment to maintaining a healthy and accessible environment for all students.

(iii) Sanitary napkin vending machine/incinerator: Currently, the college does not have sanitary napkin vending machines or incinerators installed. However, the administration is planning to purchase and install these essential facilities in the upcoming 2024-25 session, ensuring better hygiene and convenience for female students.

(iv) CSCA Room with proper furniture: Room No. 1 has been officially designated as the CSCA (College Students' Central Association) Room. This room is available for CSCA activities before regular college hours, from 10:20 AM to 3:00 PM, and again after

classes, from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM. The nominated CSCA officials hold the keys to this room and manage it according to their requirements, ensuring a space for meetings and organizational activities. The room is well-furnished with comfortable seating, desks, and proper electrical fittings to support various needs, including power supply for electronic devices. This dedicated space reflects the college's commitment to providing a supportive environment for student representation and leadership development.

(v) Student Centre for Co-Curricular activities and its regular usage:

Room No. 2 has been designated as the Student Centre for Co-Curricular Activities, available for student use before regular college hours from 10:20 AM to 3:00 PM, and after classes from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM. This room serves as a dedicated space for students to engage in various co-curricular activities such as club meetings, cultural practices, and group discussions. The room is regularly utilized by students, offering a well-maintained, flexible environment conducive to creativity, teamwork, and personal development. 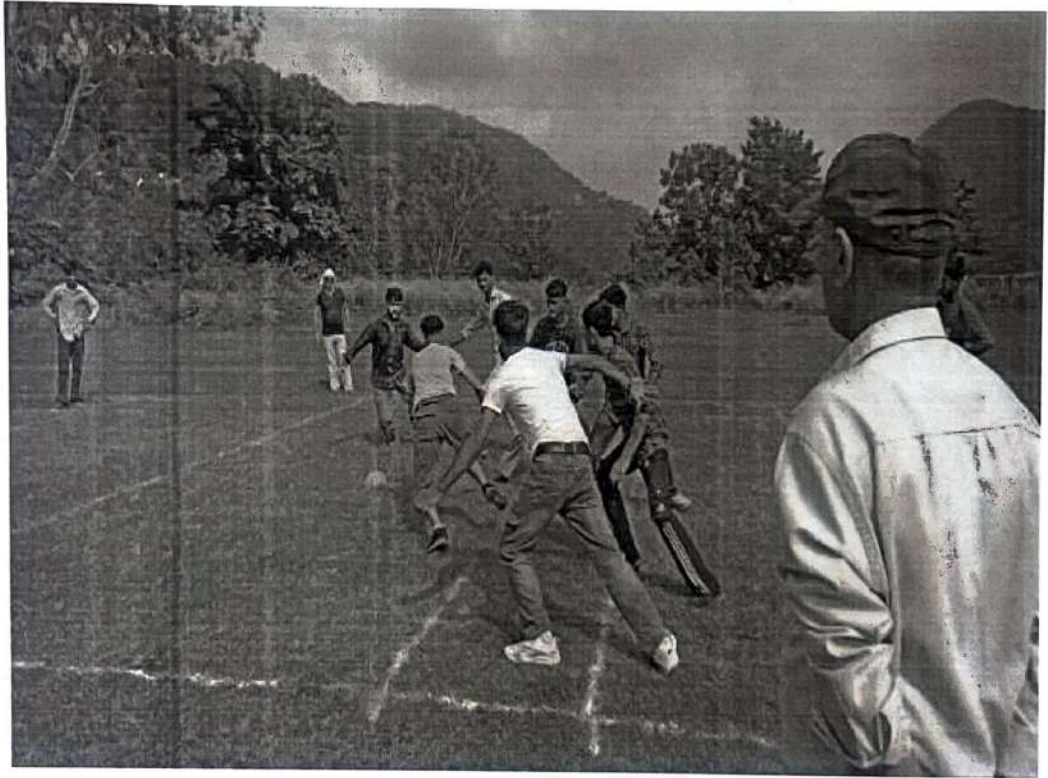

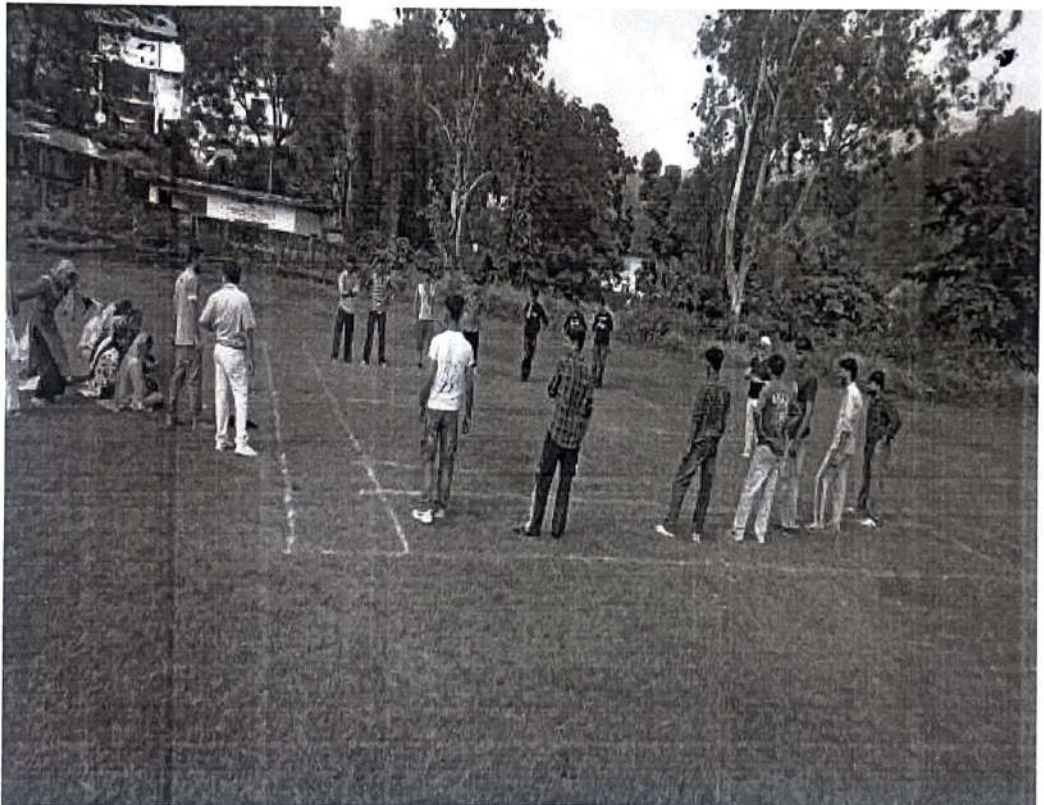



4. Rules & Regulations/Bye-Laws

D) Membership

6. General Body



Generally, 15 days' notice shall be given to the members, before the date of general body meeting, enclosing the agenda, specifying the date, time, place and issues to be discussed.

b) Quorum

The quorum of the general body meeting shall be the two third of the total strength of the general body members of the association.

7. Rights and Privilege of the members

a) Shall be entitled to participate in the meetings, cultural/educational functions and other lawful gathering, called/arranged by the association.

b) Shall have the right to vote in the meeting of the association.

8. Duties of the members

a) Elect the Governing Body of the association,

b) Attend the general body meeting,

c) Give the necessary information to the association, pertaining to any matter which is necessary to be taken by the association,

d) Meeting


Meeting of the governing body shall be held twice a year (or as and when the Government Body decides from time to time.

Dear Principal,

I am pleased to present the report on the Student Satisfaction Survey conducted for the academic session 2023-24. This survey was designed to evaluate student satisfaction with teaching quality, academic facilities, and overall college environment. The students who are regularly attending classes and having above 75 percent of attendance in the classroom have participated in this survey. The insights garnered from this survey are essential for identifying areas for improvement and enhancing the academic experience at our institution.

Survey Overview

- **Survey Format:** 16 multiple-choice questions and 1 descriptive suggestion question.
- **Respondent Count:** 113 students.
- **Gender Distribution:** 78 females, 36 males.
- **Year-wise Distribution:**
 - First Year: 60 students
 - Second Year: 26 students
 - Third Year: 27 students

Key Findings

1. Teaching and Learning

- **Syllabus Coverage:** 82% of students confirmed that teachers covered the syllabus adequately.
- **Lecture Preparation:** 85% reported that teachers prepared lectures well in advance.
- **Communication Efficiency:** 88% of students felt that teachers communicated effectively.
- **Teaching Approach:** 66% rated the teachers' approach to teaching as excellent.
- **Internal Assessment:** 82% considered the internal assessment process to be impartial.
- **Assignment Discussion:** 74% indicated that teachers discussed assignments with them.
- **Career Advancement:** 55% of students acknowledged the college's efforts to provide career advancement facilities.

- **Course Information:** 90% reported that teachers informed them about expected competencies, course outcomes, and schedules.
- **Strength Recognition:** 81% felt that teachers recognized their strengths and encouraged appropriate challenges.

2. Student Involvement and Learning Methods

- **Student Involvement:** 50% felt that the institution involves them in monitoring, review, and continuous quality improvement of the teaching-learning process.
- **Learning Methods:** 71% noted that the institution and teachers use student-centered methods such as experiential learning, collaborative learning, and problem-solving techniques.
- **Co-curricular Encouragement:** 63% agreed that teachers encourage participation in co-curricular activities.
- **Skill Development:** 75% stated that the institution strives to develop soft skills, life skills, and employability skills.

3. Use of Technology and Overall Satisfaction

- **ICT Tools:** Only 27% observed that teachers frequently use ICT tools like projectors and multimedia in teaching.
- **Teaching Quality:** 56% rated the overall quality of the teaching-learning process as very good.
- **Satisfaction with Teaching Methods:** 62% expressed satisfaction with the teaching methods employed by teachers.

Student Suggestions

Several students provided constructive suggestions for further improvement, including:

- **Infrastructure Development:** Calls for an upgraded college building and better library facilities.
- **Common Rooms and Smart Classes:** Requests for the provision of common rooms and smart classrooms.
- **Drinking Water and Sanitation:** Need for reliable drinking water and improved health and sanitation facilities.

Recommendations

Based on the survey results, the following actions are recommended:

1. **Enhance Use of ICT Tools:** Invest in training and resources to encourage teachers to integrate ICT tools more frequently into their teaching methods.
2. **Improve Career Services:** Expand career guidance and placement services to better support students in their professional development.
3. **Upgrade Infrastructure:** Prioritize improvements in college infrastructure, including building upgrades, better library facilities, and the installation of smart classrooms.
4. **Increase Student Involvement:** Develop initiatives to involve students more actively in the academic quality improvement processes.

Focus on Holistic Development: Continue and expand efforts to develop students' soft skills, life skills, and employability skills.

Conclusion

The survey highlights a general satisfaction among students with the academic environment and teaching quality at Government Degree College Shri Renuka Ji. However, it also points out areas that require attention to ensure continuous improvement and meet students' evolving needs.

We are committed to addressing these areas to enhance the educational experience and overall satisfaction of our students.

Abstract

Purpose – The purpose of this present study is to analyze the role of consumers' social-psychological attributes, fiscal incentives and socio-demographics in the adoption intention and the willingness to pay more for electric vehicles (EVs).

Design/methodology/approach – A cognitive linkage model of "beliefs-intention-willingness" is analyzed using valid responses obtained from Indian consumers. The model is statistically tested at three levels: direct path effect of social-psychological attributes with financial incentives (subjective norm, personal norm, affective attitude, perceived knowledge) on adoption intention and willingness to pay, followed by the mediation of intention and the moderation of socio-demographics.

Findings – The findings reveal that the adoption intention and the willingness to pay are directly driven by all analyzed factors except financial incentives, which is not significantly associated with willingness to pay. Moreover, the adoption intention partially mediated the relation between all socio-psychological measures and willingness to pay, whereas full mediation of incentives is supported. Furthermore, the moderating effect of socio-demographics (gender, education, income) supports the integrated research model.

Research limitations/implications – The generalizability of findings may be warranted due to the limited sample territory and the sample's youth. However, young people, or millennials, are more receptive to new technologies such as electric or carbon-free automobiles. The research advocates marketers and manufacturers to craft policy interventions and strategies to upsurge the EV demands in the backdrop of emerging markets.

Originality/value – This timely study adds to the extant literature on green and clean technology automobile adoption by exemplifying the relationship between socio-psychological beliefs, intention and willingness to pay at three dimensions of contextual factors. The current study endeavors to endorse the "beliefs-intention-willingness" cognitive linkage framework in the context of Indian green transportation.


